SHAPING A NEW FUTURE WITH, IN AND FOR LINCOLN

Starting from May 2023 the UK New Artists 'Taking Place' programme fully launches!

'Taking Place' brings together two parallel and intersecting programmes which explore and celebrate creativity within Lincolnshire.

- Creative Citizens: a talent development programme for young people (14-19yrs). Built on three pillars – 'information', 'inspiration' and freedom for 'exploration' which are essential for young people to flourish and thrive.
- New Artists Collective (NAC): a crossdisciplinary group of 17 artists who are within the first 10 years of professional practice, from across the UK and Lincoln.

Through residencies, talks and workshops, the New Artist Collective and Creative Citizens are creating new works inspired by their experiences. Focused on 'place' the project aims to be a creative catalyst for artists and Lincoln. So keep a look out for playful interventions and murals popping up across the city!

We are excited to be joined on this journey by the Lincoln Museum, Lincoln Arts Centre, SO Festival, The MashUP, Sincil Bank Community Partnership, The Chateau as well as local and national artists to deliver an exciting, engaging and collaborative programme for everyone.

Agnes Ársælsdóttir's work explores the relationship between human and non-human creatures and their interaction with the environment. Their approach oscillates between intuition and analysis in a search for a new way of learning and connecting to each other with affection and radical care. Agnes graduated from Iceland University of the Arts in 2018 and later that year they started their internship with Gérald Kurdian in Paris. Agnes participated in the international project, 'United' run by UKNA and Platform Nord as well as UKNA City Takeover: Nottingham 2019.

An Artist's Perspective: Arts Facilitation and Accessibility with Laura Guthrie

Laura Guthrie is a disabled artist with 30 years of experience in theatre. She is the Artist Development Manager for Graeae, Co-Director of Meander Theatre, Co-worker as an Agent For Change with Ramps On The Moon and for 20 years as Associate Artist with Bamboozle Theatre. Trained in Theatre Design, Laura has devised, directed and designed theatre alongside Deaf, disabled and neurodiverse creatives throughout her career. She is focused on creating accessible structures for theatre making whoever she works alongside. Regularly working as an access consultant or Disability Equality trainer, past clients include Nottingham Playhouse, Birmingham Rep, Level Centre, Bold Text, Egg Box, Carbon, Ditto and Major Labia Theatre companies.

An Artist's Perspective: Film Screening of 'Reet Good' and Q&A with Pierce Starre

Pierce Starre is a Liverpool based artist working across Live Art, Performance, Photography and Video. Their work predominantly explores their cultural experiences as a queer, working class, neurodivergent individual with Deaf parents, within a broader social and political context. Their artworks provide the viewer with an opportunity to be immersed within an embodied experience, creating a platform for connection, reflection, and discussion. 'Reet Good' was commissioned as part of the UKNA Future Producers; a unique programme which supported new producers and was funded through the Arts Council National Lottery Project Grants.

An Artist's Perspective: Using Play for Work with Maja Zećo

Maja Zećo, originally from Sarajevo (Bosnia and Herzegovina) and now based in Aberdeen, is an interdisciplinary artist whose practice spans performance art, sound, video and installation. Her works are often site-specific and relational, negotiating personal and group narratives of identity and history. Many of her works are sound informed performance art pieces through which she explores her relationship with places. In 2019 Maja obtained a PhD in fine art, on sound and performance art practice supported by Gray's School of Art and the University of Aberdeen. Maja took part in UKNA City Takeover: Leicester 2022.
